

**Support Snake Valley in the legal battle to keep its own water!
Proceeds from the festival go to the Great Basin Water Network.**

Snake Valley's water is still under attack. Although favorable court decisions have been made, the battle is not over. Southern Nevada Water Authority is planning to pump massive amounts of groundwater from the basin every year. Experts believe that springs would dry up, water dependent plants would die, and eventually animals would be displaced. In short, Snake Valley would never be the same again.

In order to protect this fragile desert and our livelihoods, we will have to fight. Legal costs are likely to be very high. If you would like to help, please consider a donation. Great Basin Water Network supports scientific, technical, and legal efforts to protect the future of Snake Valley.

Booth Agreement - Rules and Regulations

- Booths will be near Baker Hall and along Saval Ave.
- Booth setup must be complete by 8 AM on Saturday, September 1. Booths must remain up until 3 PM on that day.
- No electricity will be provided for vendor booths.
- Vendors using generators will be assigned booth spaces.
- Vendors must provide their own display props such as tables, shelves, chairs, etc.
- Shade and protective canopies are recommended and must be adequately secured.
- All items for sale must be displayed within the vendor's booth space, keeping walkways clear.
- Consumption, use, or sale of alcoholic beverages, tobacco products, pornography, fireworks, smoke and stink bombs, or illegal drugs is strictly forbidden.
- Food Vendors are responsible for obtaining the necessary and appropriate food permits from the Nevada Health Division.
- The primary vendor registering for the booth space must be at least 18 years old and is responsible for the items and assistant vendors within the booth space. Booths must be staffed at all times during the Festival by the vendor or its representatives.
- Snake Valley Festival will not be liable for damage to property of vendors, or their employees or assigns, or to their persons, due to fire, robbery, accidents, acts of God, or any cause whatsoever that may arise from use and occupancy of booth and grounds. The vendor agrees to indemnify and hold harmless the Snake Valley Festival staff for any damages incurred. No overnight security will be provided.
- Snake Valley Festival reserves the right to reject or remove from the sale any items that are unsuitable for a family-oriented festival, i.e., items that are controversial, may be offensive, or have legality issues, etc.
- Vendors are responsible for keeping their booth area clean. All items related to the booth, including trash, packing materials, etc., must be removed by the vendor when the booth closes down.
- Vendors and their personnel will be expected to maintain a business-like attitude.
